

Biography Elder Eddie N. “Sam” Sampson



Elder Eddie N. “Sam” Sampson is a native of the great state of Alabama. He attended the Conecuh County Public Schools and graduated from Evergreen High School. After completing his studies at the United Electrical Institute located in Tampa Florida; Sam joined the U. S. Army. After various assignments and numerous awards, he retired from the U. S. Army in July 1998. While stationed at Ft. Belvoir, Virginia, he met and married the former Ms. Tracy Yvette Porter in May 1986. From this union they share the love of their son Eddie Jr. (Portia), grandsons Zechariah and Jeremiah, and granddaughter Autumn.

Elder Sampson rededicated his life to Jesus Christ in November 1990 at the Bethlehem Baptist Church in Alexandria, Virginia, under the leadership of Pastor Anthony A.
